SCHOOL TIMETABLE

- School begins at 8.45 am every morning
- At 9.43 am there is a tutor class every day
- Monday Thursday school ends at 3.34 pm
- On Friday school ends at 1.04 pm
- Each class is 58 minutes long

- Students are given their Journals by their tutors on the first day of school.
- First years have a group specific journal with content aimed at becoming a Successful Post Primary Student
- Used for:
 - Recording homework (Written and Learning)
 - Absent notes from parents
 - Permission to leave school notes
 - General communication between the teachers and parents/guardians
 - Academic Monitoring
- The class tutors check the journals every week.
- Parent/guardians must check and sign the journal EVERY week.

Taking care to check for graffiti, inappropriate drawings/words. The journal should be kept in a neat and presentably condition at all times

Attendance is linked directly to performance in school

Students must attend ALL day every day

If a child is absent a note must be provided to explain the absence.

More than 20 days absence Tusla must be informed

A student must report to the office if late in the morning.

Illness during the day- student to report to a Deputy Principal/Principal with permission from the teacher.

Parents may be telephoned to collect child if illness does not pass.

Students can only contact parents through the main office – not through mobile phones.

For an appointment:

- Note from parent/ guardian signed by Principal, Deputy Principal, Year Head or Tutor.
- Sign-out book/ with secretary digitally from the office before leaving.
- Sign-in in the office when returning- this will be done by the secretaries on VS Ware.
- A phone call may be made to parent to confirm the note.

At Lunch time:

 FIRST YEAR students are not allowed to leave the school grounds (this applies to 2nd & 3rd Years too)

- Usage not permitted on school grounds during class time.
- Can be used at break/lunch time but NOT during the break of class
- If a device is brought to school it is against the school's advice, therefore the school is not responsible for it's safe keeping.
- Any contact that needs to be made with a student/ parent during the day must be through the office.
- If a phone is used during lesson time it may be
- confiscated and held until the end of the day by the Deputy Principal.
- If the phone has to be confiscated a number of times it will be kept for a longer period of time, parents/ guardians will be informed of this.

HOMEWORK

Aim for 1- 1.5 hours <u>every</u> <u>weekday evening</u>



Having a set routine of 1-1.5 hours EVERY week night will help avoid arguments about homework!

AFTER SCHOOL STUDY

- Consent letters will be available at the start of term
 - Monday to Thursday until 5.30pm
 - €10 per week
 - More details will be given at the beginning of the term.

LOCKERS

- €20 Annual Rental Fee
- Caretakers will go to the tutor classes on the first day to assign paid lockers (this may take 2 days to complete) Payment made though vsware Fees.
 - The locker will require a medium sized lock
 - Please put the spare key away somewhere safe!
- Lockers can only be used before and after school and at break/lunchtime
- Lockers can not be used between classes.

- Develop an appreciation of the civilisations of the ancient Greek and Roman worlds and the ancient Greek and Latin languages
- Classics gives students the opportunity to engage with the culture, literature, languages, art and material culture of Ancient Greece and Rome in a variety of ways. The course comprises three strands, and students will study two out of these three strands. The first strand, core component myth and daily life, will be taken by all students. Alongside this, students have the option of studying either the Classical Studies component (World of Achilles and Rome, Centre of an Empire) or the Classical Language component (Latin or Ancient Greek).
